



Rivers End graces 130 acres along a wide, navigable waterway, which leads to the North Fork of the St. Lucie River and to the Intracoastal Waterway beyond. Just 110 estate homes will be permitted in this exclusive low-density community.

Half-acre or larger homesites are interspersed among scenic wetland preserves and lakes, or overlook the wide waterway and Evergreen Country Club beyond. Sensitive land planning has assured that Rivers End homes enjoy the utmost in privacy and homesites that seem even larger, with no back-door neighbors to restrict the peaceful vistas of the preserve areas.

Unique in all Florida, stretching along the waterway is a 15-acre man-

made habitat for the endangered gopher tortoise. Created by Rivers End after more than two years of study with state agencies, the habitat recreates the lovely topography and foliage favored by this fascinating creature. Happily for Rivers End residents, when protected the tortoise co-exists quite nicely with man.

Situated among prestigious residential neighborhoods and secluded country club communities, the privacy of Rivers End is assured by an electronically controlled entry gate. Residents can enjoy the prestige and ambience of country club living without the equity and membership expenses. However, memberships are available at several golf and country clubs just a few minutes' drive away.
